
TSX Rear Brake Pad Wear Class Action

Currently Applies To: ALL 2009 TSXs and some 2010 TSXs

On April 15, 2010, Judge Margaret Morrow of the United States District Court, Central District of California, entered an Order of Preliminary Approval of a class-action settlement in an action entitled *Browne et al. v. American Honda Motor Co., Inc.*, Case No. CV 09-06750. The class-action lawsuit involved claims of premature rear brake pad wear on all 2009 and some 2010 TSXs. The court will hold a fairness hearing on July 26, 2010, to determine if it will grant final approval of the proposed settlement. If the proposed settlement receives final approval from the District Court, the settlement will become effective 30 days after entry of the final approval order unless an appeal is filed. The Settlement Agreement, Notice to Class, and related documents are available online at www.accordsettlement.com. If final approval is granted, and assuming no appeal is filed, administration of the settlement will be handled by an outside third-party vendor not related to American Honda. We will keep you advised of the status of the settlement.

New Rear Brake Pad Set

The original rear brake pads have been superseded by a new rear brake pad kit that will be available mid-June 2010, and a new pad replacement procedure has been developed to improve wear characteristics. For detailed pad replacement instructions, refer to the instructions included in the rear brake pad kit or Rear Brake Pad Inspection/Replacement information in ISIS.

Disc Refinishing

Please review your repair policies when replacing pads. Our investigations have shown that the need for disc refinishing should be rare. Discs should be refinished only if they are out of spec, backed up by run-out measurements. For detailed inspection instructions, refer to the appropriate service manual.
